Most community-supported agriculture programs in the region are fully subscribed for the current growing season, so Westchester residents hoping to join one should start planning for 2009. Here is a selection with pickup points in or near the county.

BEDFORD The Sunraven Mindful Gardening Project, 501 Guard Hill Road, offers 20 shares that cost \$750 annually, with a requirement of two hours of work weekly from March until November. Fully subscribed for 2008. Information: www.sunraven.org.

BEDFORD HILLS Rainbeau Ridge, 49 David's Way, is home to a goat cheese operation, education center and community garden. Fully subscribed for the near future, the farm charges a membership fee and allows its more than 100 members to buy produce weekly a la carte. Information: www.rainbeauridge.com.

BREWSTER **Ryder Farm** Cottage Industries, 400 Starr Ridge Road, offered 20 shares this year at \$450 for a 20-week season, with pickup at the farm. Information: www.ryderfarmorganic.com or (845) 279-4161.

BUCHANAN Central pickup at 3199 Albany Post Road for shares from Stoneledge Farm in South Cairo (www.stoneledgefarmny.org). Stoneledge offered 40 shares in Westchester in 2008, at \$465 for a 24-week season of vegetables, with an add-on option of \$210 for a 20-week season of fruits. Registration for 2009 has begun. LARCHMONT My Farm Share, 70 Hillcrest Avenue, a third-party C.S.A. business started in 2006, distributes certified organic produce from local farms door to door in Westchester County. The Brussel family, which runs it, sold all 600 shares this year, charging \$550 for a 22-week season of vegetables and \$400 for a 20-week season of fruit. NYACK The farmers' market (Thursdays on Main Street) is a pickup point for shares from Blooming Hill Farm, 1251 Route 208 in Blooming Grove, Orange County. The farm has an ongoing enrollment of 65 shares -- \$500 for a full share, \$250 for a half. Shares can also be picked up at the farm. Information: www.bloominghillfarm.com or (845) 782-7310.

Two farm stands worth their weight in beets and carrots are right here in Westchester County. The county's own Hilltop Hanover Farm, 1271 Hanover Street, Yorktown Heights (www.hilltophanoverfarm.org), is open Tuesday through Saturday, noon to 7 p.m., through Oct. 31 (the stand is self-serve, so it's B.Y.O.B. -- bring your own bags). The Stone Barns Farm Market, 630 Bedford Road, Pocantico Hills (www.stonebarnscenter.org), is open Wednesday 3 to 6 p.m., and Friday and Saturday, 1 to 4 p.m. (there is a \$5 fee for parking).

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
